

Website Cookies Policy

Our website uses cookies. By using our website and agreeing to this policy, you consent to our use of cookies in accordance with the terms of this policy.

Please note that this site does not collect any personal data from visitors.

(1) About cookies

Cookies are files, often including unique identifiers, that are sent by web servers to web browsers, and which may then be sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server.

Cookies can be used by web servers to identify and track users as they navigate different pages on a website, and to identify users returning to a website.

Cookies may be either “persistent” cookies or “session” cookies.

A persistent cookie consists of a text file sent by a web server to a web browser, which will be stored by the browser and will remain valid until its set expiry date (unless deleted by the user before the expiry date).

A session cookie, on the other hand, will expire at the end of the user session, when the web browser is closed.

(3) How we use cookies

Cookies do not contain any information that personally identifies you. We may use the information we obtain from your use of our cookies for the following purposes:

- (1) to improve the website’s usability
- (2) to gather usage statistics

(4) Blocking cookies

Most browsers allow you to refuse to accept cookies. For example:

- In Internet Explorer you can refuse all cookies by clicking “Tools”, “Internet Options”, “Privacy”, and selecting “Block all cookies” using the sliding selector;
- In Firefox you can block all cookies by clicking “Tools”, “Options”, and un-checking “Accept cookies from sites” in the “Privacy” box.
- In Google Chrome, click the wrench icon  on the browser toolbar. Select “Settings”, “Show advanced settings”. In the “Privacy” section, click “Content Settings”. In the “Cookies” section,

choose “Block sites from setting any data”.

For other browsers and devices you should consult your instruction manual

Blocking all cookies will, however, have a negative impact upon the usability of many websites.

(5) Deleting cookies

You can also delete cookies already stored on your computer:

- In Internet Explorer, you must manually delete cookie files;
- In Firefox, you can delete cookies by, first ensuring that cookies are to be deleted when you “clear private data” (this setting can be changed by clicking “Tools”, “Options” and “Settings” in the “Private Data” box) and then clicking “Clear private data” in the “Tools” menu.
- In Google Chrome, click the wrench icon  on the browser toolbar. Select “Settings”, “Show advanced settings”. In the “Privacy” section, click “Content Settings”. In the “Cookies” section, click “All Cookies and site data”, “remove all”

For other browsers and devices you should consult your instruction manual
